Cardinia council have identified an upgrade to Cardinia Life as one of their key projects moving forward. The two decade old facility has seen the population that it serves more than double in that time, with major works required to keep the facility functional.

This project will see substantial renovation works undertaken to bring Cardinia Life up to a modern standard, while adding 4 new courts, including a show court, 1500sqm gymnastics facility, more seating and refurbished change rooms and amenities to support a rapidly growing basketball community.

Council have already allocated \$20 million and require an additional \$40 million to complete works.

Remaining project amount required is \$40 million with \$20 million sought from the State Government and \$20 million sought from the Federal Government.



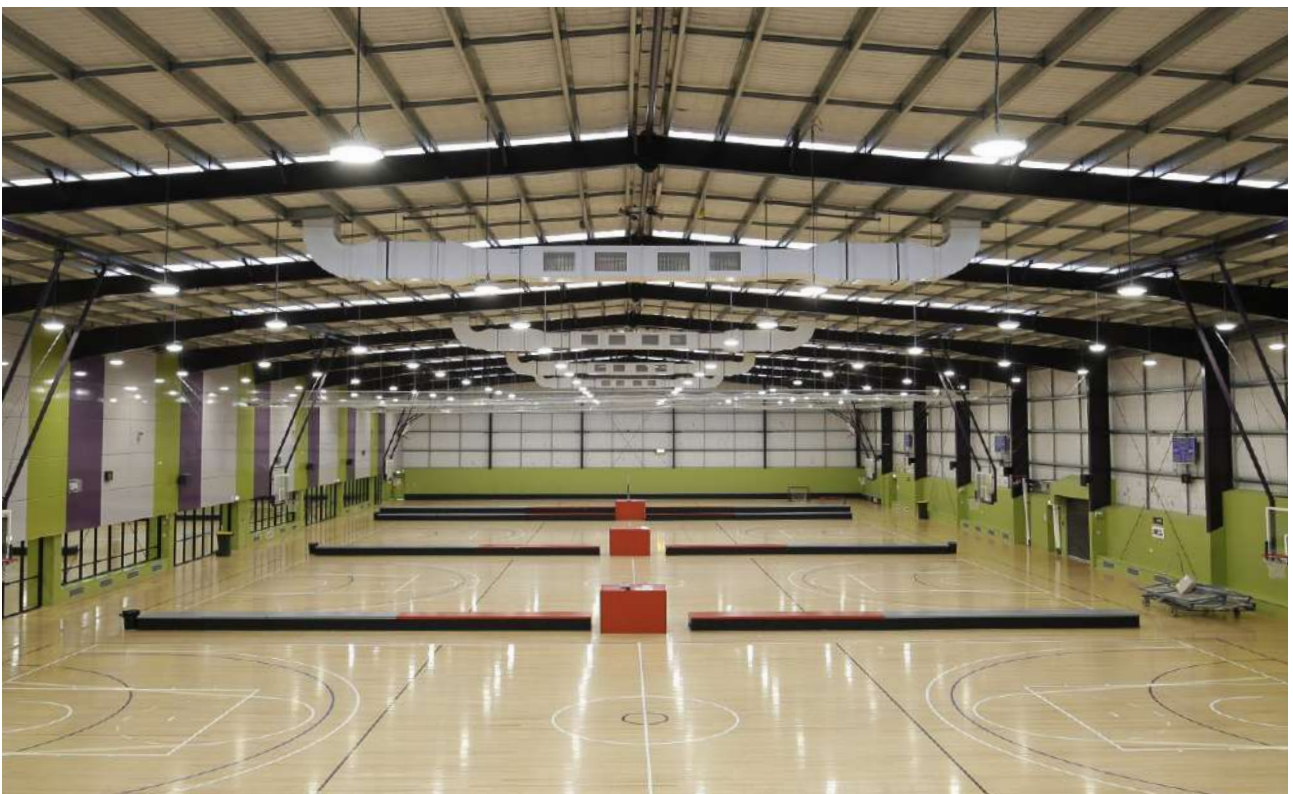

Mornington Shire Council have identified a shortfall of at least 5 courts in the region, with that number increasing to 10 courts required by 2036. Council's sports capacity indoor plan supports an additional 3 courts at Dromana Secondary College as a key funding priority to fill this gap.

Demand for basketball in the region has far outgrown supply, with 384 families unable to participate in the sport in 2025 due to a lack of available courts. The current shortfall in courts is forcing games to finish as late as 11 pm, an unsafe time for young children.

Southern Peninsula Basketball Association is at 100% capacity for participation due to a lack of courts, without immediate investment to support new facilities, participation growth will be capped.

Total project cost is \$23 million.

The redevelopment of the Korumburra Indoor Recreation Centre changerooms will deliver modern, female friendly facilities to support the activities at the centre. The key benefits of the project include separation of changerooms and public toilets to improve child safety, the addition of two unisex accessible toilet / shower spaces and additional public toilets to accommodate the large crowds that attend events at the centre.

Basketball participation in South Gippsland is significant and growing, particularly amongst those under 18. Korumburra stands out as a hub of basketball activity and council, BV and the association are united in advocating for the upgrade of the Korumburra Stadium as a key infrastructure project.

Total project cost is \$2 million.

East Gippsland Shire Council is designing a multi-purpose indoor sporting facility to be located at the Lakes Entrance Aquadome site.

The stadium design will include:

- A three-court multi-purpose indoor sports stadium with compliant playing facilities that will boost sporting participation and keep pace with the growing population and high demand in Lakes Entrance.
- A shared entrance and reception with the Lakes Entrance Aquadome.
- Realignment of existing road and car parking to accommodate the new facility.

Council has been provided \$800,000 from the Victorian Government through Sport and Recreation Victoria to develop a design for this project. This process is currently underway and is expected to be complete by March 2027. Construction can commence following the completion of this step.

Total estimated project cost \$18 million.

Mornington Shire Council have identified a shortfall of at least 5 courts in the region, with that number increasing to 10 courts required by 2036. Council's sports capacity indoor plan support an additional 4 courts at Mornington Secondary College as a key funding priority to fill this gap.

An additional 4 courts will extend the current 3 court facility, bringing the total to 7 courts and 2 show courts.

The facility will serve the needs of both the school and the basketball community. Mornington District Basketball Association (MDBA) continues to grow at a rapid rate, with almost 4,000 members at a growth rate of 21% over the past 5 years, and more than 400 junior and senior teams.

Without immediate intervention to supply more courts, MDBA will be forced to turn away junior participants.

Total project cost is \$20 million.

Murrindindi Shire Council in collaboration with Alexandra Secondary College have been developing a feasibility study, design and order of costs for a replacement relief and community facility in Alexandra for basketball.

The existing stadium is non compliant and at the end of its life and in urgent need of replacement. Without action, the community will lose access to courts as the facility becomes unusable.

The facility will serve both the school and the broader community, as a community Centre, high ball stadium and as an emergency relief Centre.

Total project cost is \$22 million.

Mount Alexander Shire council identified in their 2021/22 Highball Feasibility Study the opportunity to partner with the Castlemaine Secondary College Stadium to add two new indoor courts to cater for the strongly increasing basketball participation.

The upgrade will also provide supporting amenities and will be of benefit to both the basketball community and the school.

Total project cost is \$25M.

The Mildura Sporting Precinct requires funding for new basketball rings to allow the stadium to host NBL and WNBL games. The stadium has previously hosted WNBL games for the Bendigo Spirit, bringing significant economic benefit to the municipality.

Council have sourced quotes and confirmed a scope of work and have identified the project to be of great importance to support basketball and provide strong economic benefit to the community.

Total project cost is \$165,000 for the installation of new rings, storage and removal of old rings.

Council are seeking to upgrade and modernise the Myrtleford Indoor Stadium to achieve compliance with Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) requirements, Basketball Victoria Facility Guidelines, and contemporary gender-equity standards, while improving safety, accessibility, functionality and multi-use capacity for a high-demand regional facility.

The project will involve the rebuilding of change facilities, upgrade of kiosk, construction of a meeting room and community program space, ensuring the stadium meets modern compliance standards.

The upgrades will assist to remove barriers for female participants, as well as older participants seeking to return to sport.

Total project cost is \$700,000.

Greater Shepparton Basketball Association and the Greater Shepparton City Council have completed a number of strategic studies that reflect the immediate need for additional courts in a fast-growing community.

Council have recently revisited the detailed design following extensive community and stakeholder consultation and have prepared a more sustainable staged approach to the redevelopment, which is cognisant of the constrained economic conditions of the Australian and Victorian Governments.

A proposal to add an additional 4 courts including a show court with seating of up to 3,000 to the Greater Shepparton Indoor Sports Stadium to transform it into the Shepparton Sports Centre is the Councils highest infrastructure priority and is strongly supported by Basketball Victoria.

This redevelopment will create significant positive economic benefits to the state and region to support and diversify the visitor economy, enhancing the growth of important industry sectors through:

- Generating \$73.96 million in output during construction, supporting 210 local jobs
- Over a 10 year period once constructed new tournaments and events hosted by an expanded sports and events centre are expected to attract approximately 134,200 new visitors to Greater Shepparton
- Over a 10 year period an expanded sports and events centre would generate \$84.35 million in economic stimulation (direct and indirect spending) whilst also ensuring existing events can be retained and hosted in the region which is also valued at \$65.43 million helping generate a combined \$149.78 million in economic impact into the Greater Shepparton economy helping support an additional 79 local jobs annually.

**Coupled with the 2 court VISY Stadium in the precinct, which has recently undergone upgrades with support from the Victorian Government, the project will deliver a regional precinct of 10 courts with a dedicated showcourt.**

Total project cost is \$32 million.

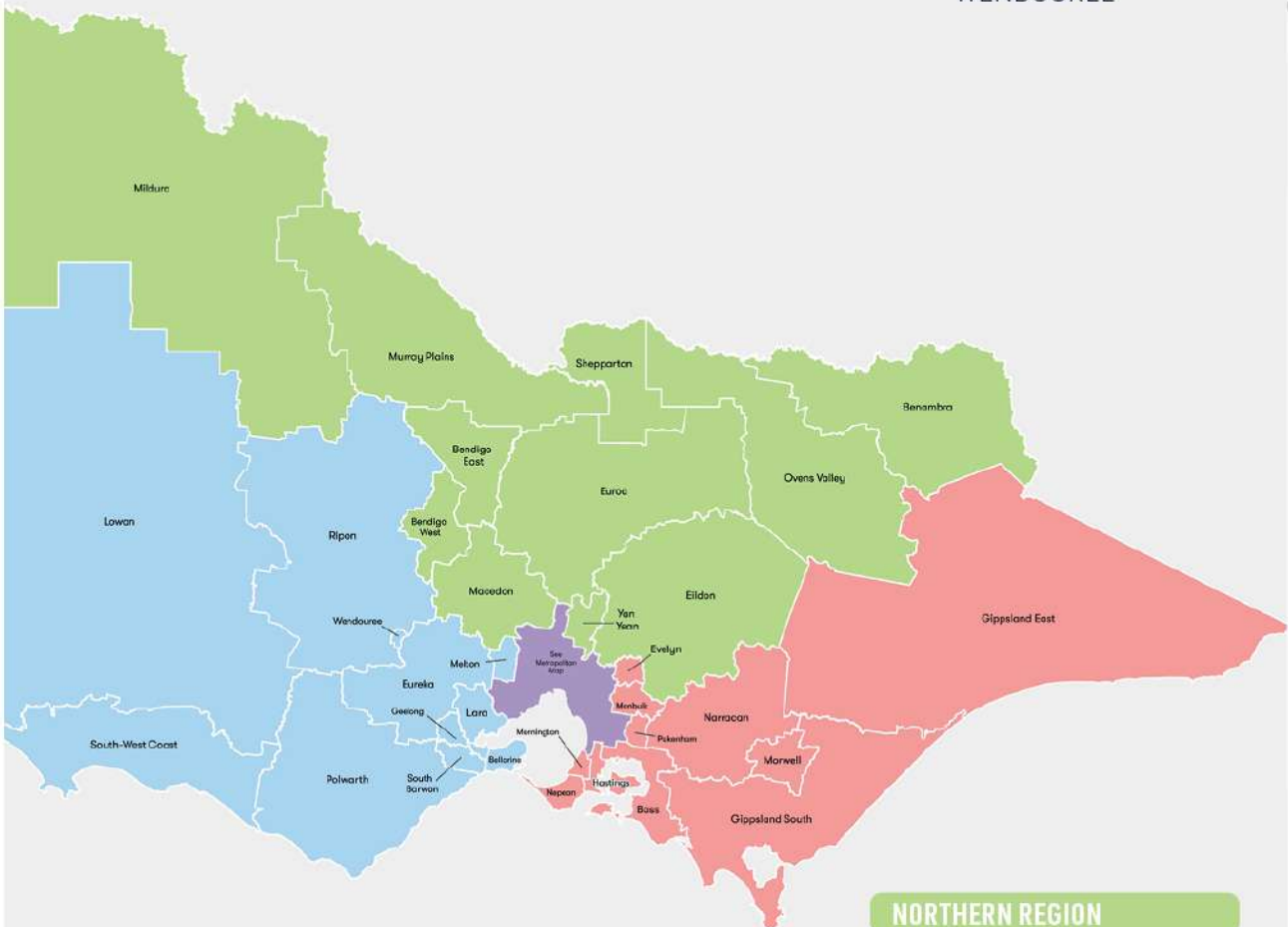
Wallan Basketball Association has grown at a rapid rate in recent years and are currently at capacity. Without a new facility, the association will turn participants away.

The new Indoor Multi-sports Facility in the Alexandra precinct is one of Ararat Rural City Councils top 6 infrastructure priorities for the municipality.

The facility would include 3 basketball courts, gymnastics to local club level, and a squash court. All of which will help create an indoor community sporting hub in the Alexandra precinct and service the increasing basketball community in the region.

Total project cost is \$12 million.

The Bellarine Sports Centre expansion builds upon the previous feasibility and planning work undertaken by the Bellarine Peninsula Basketball Association and the City of Greater Geelong. The Association has reached operational capacity across ten different venues and needs to increase the provision of indoor basketball courts on the Bellarine Peninsula to meet the growing demand.

Basketball Victoria supports the proposed 3 court expansion of Bellarine Sports Centre, which will integrate with an existing 3 court facility at Bellarine Secondary College. This proposal will support both the secondary college and the rapid growth of Bellarine Peninsula Basketball Association. With the association currently facing manufactured byes for up to 25% of their games due to a lack of available courts, thousands of young basketballers will be turned away from the sport without immediate action to address the court shortage.

Total project cost is \$46.8 million.

An upgrade of the Leisuretime Sports Precinct will upgrade and expand the current facility from a 3 to 4 court facility to benefit the rapidly growing basketball community. Council have also identified the opportunity to add 2 more courts into the future in a stage 2.

The facility will be designed to meet basketball-compliant standards, with new flooring and LED lighting. The project also includes the removal of asbestos from the walls, refurbishment of the roof, and reconfiguration of the rooms off the courts into storage spaces and a referee room.

Indoor sports participation could grow from 25,000 to over 38,000 participants by 2041 if current participation rates are maintained. The Leisuretime Sports Precinct will be a crucial indoor sports facility to support the anticipated growth in the northern planning precinct, which is projected to increase by approximately 40,000 to 50,000 people by 2041.

Total project cost is \$15 million.

RISEC will deliver a 5000 – 8000 show court to host major basketball events at a national and international level. The stadium will support the current Geelong WNBL and NBL1 teams and support future NBL expansion in Geelong.

It is estimated the project will generate 354 jobs and \$100 million in regional benefit.

Northern Grampians Shire currently has designs completed for a full redevelopment of the Stawell Sports & Aquatic Centre.

The project is broken up into two stages, with the second stage including two new basketball courts with changerooms.

This project will reconfigure the entire centre as there is currently only 1 court with no toilets accessible after hours. The project is of great importance to Northern Grampians and the basketball community to immediately improve basketball access.

The approximate cost for stage two is \$16million.

Council have identified the requirement to upgrade change facilities and amenities at the Warracknabeal Leisure Centre. These upgrades will deliver a more equitable and inclusive facility for the Warracknabeal community, with notable improved access for members of the all-abilities community.

The upgrade will allow improved access as the current facility is in urgent need of renewal so that it does not prove unusable into the future.

Total project cost is \$1.5 million

Council has completed a basketball and netball strategy identifying a current need to add more courts to support rapidly growing demand for basketball facilities. Epping North is identified as councils highest indoor stadium priority for the short term.

Epping North is planned to deliver at least 8 additional courts to support local basketball participants who are growing at one of the highest rates in Victoria. Participation in basketball is expected to double in the next 10 years with the support of new facilities.

Total project cost is \$53 million.

This project is driven by the school's need for a multi-court stadium and aligns with the recommendations from the Council's Stadium Sports Strategy 2023 to cater for multiple sports including basketball, volleyball and netball. Councils strategy identified a requirement for two four-court stadiums in Maroondah, with this site being one of only two available options.

The new stadium will support the school's curriculum and extracurricular activities and enhance the overall educational experience by offering high-quality sports amenities, promoting physical education, and encouraging a healthy lifestyle among students.

It will also address the community's need for volleyball and basketball facilities.

The project will require funding from multiple sources, including the Department of Education and State and Federal Governments. It is anticipated that the stadium would be used seven days and five nights a week.

Total project cost is \$36,871,245.

Nunawading Basketball Stadium is home to the largest basketball association in the country, with more than 16,000 weekly participants.

An independent feasibility study conducted by Brian Mott Consulting in 2015 identified a shortfall to meet demand in Nunawading Basketball's catchment of 20 indoor basketball courts by 2021 – since 2021 that number has only increased.

After funding commitments from Whitehorse Council (\$35m) and the Federal Government (\$45m), a shortfall of \$30m remains to deliver a new 11 court multi-purpose indoor sports stadium.

Remaining project amount required is \$30 million.

Council have completed a Stadium Sports Strategy which identifies a redevelopment and expansion of The Rings as as the highest advocacy project for the municipality. The redevelopment will cater for multiple high ball sports.

Council have identified the need as short term (0-3 years) due to the rapidly increasing number of basketball participants in the Maroondah community.

Council have allocated \$20 million in their budget to cover one third of the total project cost. Council are seeking an additional \$40 million of funding.

Total project cost is \$60 million.

Council have identified the need to upgrade Sheahans Stadium to add two new courts to support the strong growth Manningham is seeing in basketball.

The works have been scoped in two stages, one to complete internal upgrades, while the second will add two new courts.

Stage one will provide new change rooms and amenities, expanding office spaces and bringing the stadium up to current standards. The Federal Government have committed \$3.5 million for these works, with an additional \$1.5 required.

Stage two will add two new courts, while also expanding the run off of existing courts to ensure they meet modern compliance standards. The works will also feature parking upgrades to ensure more participants can access the sport. The works are estimated to cost \$12 million.

Total project cost required:

Coburg High School approved a new masterplan in 2021, with the plan prioritising an indoor sports centre proposal. After receiving funding for stage 1 of the master plan in 2022, an indoor sports centre is now the highest priority funding requirement for the school.

Coburg High School have an entitlement to two courts, with additional funding required to complete the needed four-court project.

The total project cost in 2022 was estimated at \$22.5m, with Merri-Bek council having made a \$3m financial contribution to the project.

Casey council is a rapidly growing region, and based on council's court strategy, Casey is at least 46 courts short. Based on population projections, Casey are set to be 68 courts short by 2041.

Council have identified land to develop a new 8-12 court facility. Funding is required for a detailed masterplan to advance the need for desperately needed courts.

Masterplan cost is \$500,000.

The Kennedy Community Centre (KCC) stage two development has been established in partnership with the City of Kingston. It embraces Council's strategic plan and the opportunities for the site to contribute to "a diverse, dynamic community where we all share a sustainable, safe, attractive environment and a thriving economy".

The KCC will significantly enhance capacity to meet increasing demand for basketball facilities. KCC Stage two plan comprises a 4-6-court community hi-ball facility with a show court with 1500 spectator seating. Stage two will significantly contribute to meeting key needs contained within City of Kingston's Sport and Recreation Strategy:

- 7 extra basketball courts to meet demand by 2036.
- 16 extra netball courts to meet demand by 2036.

The KCC site in Dingley is easily accessible from all City of Kingston residential areas. The addition of 4-6 new courts will be the largest recent investment into one of the most underserved basketball communities in Kingston.

Total project cost is \$60 million.

The City of Moonee Valley is the only metropolitan municipality in Victoria without a compliant indoor sports facility available for basketball.

With more than 4000 basketballers in the area and no indoor stadium, Moonee Valley is the most under-provided basketball community in Victoria.

A minimum 4-6 court facility is required to meet immediate community needs, with an additional facility required in the next 5 years to support growth.

Essendon Fields present the most viable site option for a new indoor facility and is supported by Basketball Victoria, Keilor Basketball Association and all local clubs.

Total project cost is \$20-\$30 million.

Council and the Maribyrnong Sports Academy are actively pursuing an agreement to extend the existing basketball facilities at the Academy and Maribyrnong Aquatic Centre, project will provide 2 additional compliant courts, total of 4 once completed.

The Point Cook Indoor Facility (East Werribee PSP) is proposed to feature 12 indoor multi-use sport courts, multi-purpose dry programming rooms, café, meeting rooms, operator and sport administration office areas and associated amenities. Cost planning estimated the design and construction cost of the Point Cook Indoor Facility at \$116.3M and flagged that the facility would need to be delivered in up to three stages, given the significant capital cost of delivering and constructing indoor facilities.

Point Cook, a suburb of 70,000 residents, is not currently home to a Stadium of more than two courts.

Wyndham City is advocating for a \$200k funding allocation to begin the planning for the proposed Point Cook Indoor Sports Centre.

Sunbury Basketball Association and Sunbury College have partnered to address the shortfall of facilities in the region. The Hume City Council identified in their Indoor Sports Plan a shortfall of six courts in the area are required in the immediate term to support future growth.

A four court stadium is proposed on school land with supporting amenities. The stadium is the highest priority project for the school and for the Sunbury Basketball Association.

Total project cost is \$30 million.

Wyndham Council through the Wyndham Sports Strategy 2045 have identified the need for several additional courts in the municipality, with a facility in Tarneit required to support the growth of the community.

Eagle Stadium opened in 2015 and is programmed at full occupancy during peak times, showing the strong demand for indoor basketball facilities within the region. Due to this strong demand, there is a need for council's next indoor facility project to be fast-tracked to cater for community demand.

In February 2025, Council appointed Brand Architects to commence the detailed design of the Tarneit Indoor Sports Facility.

As a key growth area for basketball moving forward, additional infrastructure within the City of Wyndham is key to ensure equitable access to indoor basketball facilities for all communities within Victoria.

Total project cost for a five-court facility with supporting infrastructure is \$60 million.
